






Be Persevering, Be Resilient



Congratulations to Our S6 Graduates



Summary of our students' HKDSE results (2018-2020) as follows:




Destination of graduate students

To show her dedication to True Light and environmental protection, alumna Ms. Cherry Wong donated about 1,000 cloth face masks to our school. Sewed with the TLGC logo, the masks consist of two components: an inner layer (100 per cent of woven) and outer layer (85 per cent of woven and 15 per cent of polyester). To ensure they are breathable and comfortable, these specially designed masks allow students to adjust the length of the ear loops. Not only can students wash these masks using warm water and light detergent, but they can also add an antiviral filter to the masks. Ms. Wong also paid a visit to our school, gave the masks to our students and reminded them to stay healthy and resilient during hard times.

Our students, including team leader Ceci Chui Mei Yan (5B), Helen Kan Hei Lam (5A), Natanakumar Mirnaali (5D) and Thebe Nimsing (5D) won the championship in the Social Innovation Community 4.0 Competition (2019-20) organised by The Hong Kong Council of Social Service. The team designed a food waste collection vehicle – Easy Car – that transforms leftover food into fertiliser for farms. They hoped Easy Car will encourage people to reduce the amount of rubbish on the streets and beautify the city.

Community Service – Zooming Christmas & Scarf Knitting

True Light girls have been actively taking part in diverse community service in hope to make a positive impact on our society. Through their community contributions, not only are they helping people regardless of their socio-economic status, they have also been connecting with others while developing soft skills they will use throughout their lives. We spoke to three True Light girls about their community experiences and hopes for the future.

Cheung Chiu Fei (5C)

In December 2020, I celebrated Christmas in a unique way – teaching English and playing with primary students in an online community activity called Zooming Christmas.

It was a truly meaningful and memorable event to me. Prior to the activity, we first designed some interesting games and prepare some teaching materials. Dividing ourselves into different groups, we came up with some innovative ideas. I was so thankful to my group members for their hard work and time.

Elatedly, we finally got to meet the children on ZOOM. During the activity, two True Light girls were responsible for teaching one primary student. The girl in my group was a bit shy, but she was cheerful and smart as she quickly understood what we were teaching. The activity ended with singing the Christmas songs together. Her laughter and innocence brightened my day.

Despite meeting the primary students online, we solved all technical issues to make this activity happen. I would like to thank my teachers and group members for their effort and useful advice. It was also fascinating as the event combined our kind acts with happiness.

During the first-day activity, we were in charge of a teaching session and some English activities. It was a bit challenging when there were no teachers next to us during the ZOOM meeting. But we tried our best to act as little teachers and taught the girl in our group some vocabulary items. The activity helped us understand more about the girl who expressed great interest in drawing.

On the second day, we changed our teaching approach – using drawing to teach new words. It successfully attracted the girl's attention as she focused more on our lesson. The activity taught me a valuable lesson as I appeared too seriously. I should have acted more naturally to make the lessons more stimulating and interesting. But it was such a meaningful event as I was able to build up confidence and leadership skills whilst contributing to the community.

Yannes Chung Cheuk Yan (5B)

Even though some of our scheduled community activities have been cancelled, we always try to do something meaningful to serve the community this year. One of our activities is to invite some True Light girls to knit scarves as gifts for the people in need. The reason for making scarves was to spread love and care to the community, especially the elderly who need warm clothing in winter.

Knitting scarfs seems feasible as we can do it anywhere and anytime. As we have been staying home for a long time, it is a good way to relieve our study stress and spend our time more wisely. For those who do not know how to knit, we can use ZOOM meetings as a platform to teach students some knitting skills.

Not having delivered our scarves to the elderly last winter, we have decided to meet them in person and give them our handmade gifts when the COVID-19 pandemic ends. This community work provides us with the opportunity to be connected with others in the society while developing some useful soft skills.

Meeting Our New Vice Principal Dr. Mui Lai Yuk

Being a familiar face at True Light, Dr Mui has already made her mark as our new Vice-Principal since September 2020, especially in her dedication to taking a more rounded approach to education. Before taking on her new position, she was previously our Discipline and Guidance Mistress, Panel Head of Business, Accounting and Financial Studies (BAFS), Assistant Career Mistress of Career Guidance Committee, and a distinguisted student at our school.

Having served in True Light meticulously and zealously, Dr Mui shared with us her valuable learning and teaching experience, the challenges and gains from her new position, and some advice for our current True Light girls.

Reporter: Why did you decide to become a teacher?

Dr. Mui: My dream was to be a teacher since kindergarten. During my childhood, I used to play the role as a teacher and read aloud the passages every day at home. The teachers at True Light also inspired me to be a teacher as they often showed care and were doing their part to support us, such as telling us what mistakes we made and learnt. They were easily contactable as we talked to each other after school every day. Having graduated from my Commerce studies in Canada, I followed my dream to pursue a teaching profession in Hong Kong. I hoped to follow in my teachers' footsteps, and give support to my students when they are having difficulties.

Reporter: What made you choose to teach True Light?

Dr. Mui: I believe my school holds a special meaning to me and other True Light girls. With a lot of invaluable experience and skills acquired from my learning in True Light, I am determined to devote my time and energies to my alma mater. As an alumna, I very much care about the school's development, the students' growth and academic results. My enthusiasm for True Light has also inspired me to make an impact over my students. This explained why I always want to teach here.



Reporter: What are some unforgettable experiences in your teaching life at True Light?

Dr. Mui:

I love being a class teacher as this is a pragmatic approach to getting to know each of my students. What I typically did as a class teacher was to spend time talking and listening to them. This provided me a brilliant opportunity to understand their distinctive learning and pastoral needs. For example, if my students encountered problems with their parents, I tried to be a mediator to build bridges and settle disputes. I also frequently make a conscious effort to observe my students even though this is not something huge. Observation is beneficial to the personal growth of young people because you can give them care and support. If someone has no confidence at all, you can always observe and tell them what they have done well. You will feel exhilarated when you see them grow.

But the best part of being a class teacher is the enormous fulfillment in guiding my students in their learning and personal development. I endeavoured to impart positive attitudes and values to my students, and it is always fulfilling to witness their life journey and growth in True Light.

Reporter: What is the difference between being a teacher and Vice-Principal?

Dr. Mui:

For a subject and class teacher, I placed greater emphasis on my students' learning progress and pastoral needs. However, as a Vice-Principal, my first priority is to explore different approaches to helping students learn better and engage in their studies. Room has to be given to students to explore and to learn, a lot of times through failure.


Being a Vice-Principal can be challenging as you have to manage multiple administrative tasks, such as devising contingency plans and providing a positive learning environment for students to learn more effectively. I am thankful to my colleagues who offered notable support for all of my tasks.

Reporter: What advice would you give to our current True Light girls?

Dr. Mui: Treasure your school life. During your secondary school years, you often make many close confidants, and your friendship with them is always strong enough to last.

Also gain greater exposure to diverse learning experiences. Try to partake in multiple learning activities which would help you better understand yourself and choose the study path which best suits you.

3D Mural Painting "Missed and Mixed Touches"

The Visual Arts (VA) Subject Panel has produced two full wall murals on the 5th floor in the school new annex. The murals use the two-way 3D illusion elements to show two different paintings. The first painting expresses the balcony scene of Romeo and Juliet, whereas the second work shows two talented True Light girls who are dancing and playing the violin. When the viewers walk in between the mural walls, they can view the paintings from different angles and interact with the characters. Not only does this artwork give viewer a vibrant art tour, but it also showcases our students' artistic talents and creativity.

3D Mural Painting "Missed and Mixed Touches" in the Performance Art Gallery

The first artwork uses the two-way 3D illusion elements to illustrate the balcony scene of Romeo and Juliet. When you walk toward it in one direction, you see Romeo declaring his love for Juliet. And if you walk from the opposite direction, you see Juliet swearing her true love to Romeo. The artwork creatively shows the same scene from different perspectives.

The second artwork also uses the two-way 3D illusion elements to highlight the multiple talents of True Light girls. When viewed from one angle, you

see a girl vibrantly and cheerfully dancing. When viewed from other sides, you see another girl skillfully playing the violin. Matched with colourful painting styles, the artwork is a subtle way to display the bright artistic talents of our students.

Appreciation Method

The artwork presents multiple paintings when viewed from different angles. When the viewers walk in between the mural walls, they can view the paintings from different angles, interact with the characters and take many interesting photos. If you film the paintings, it seems you are filming a moving story.




Virtual Info Day 2020


