- New regulations on hiring out school facilities were applied to avoid any acts or activities endangering the national security.
- Review of all library collection was done before the end of August 2023 to ensure that the library books, publications and leaflets do not contain content that endangers national security. The books that may pose a threat to national security have been written off.
- Books purchased by the subject panel heads for the school library were reviewed by the teacher librarian first to make sure that no content will endanger national security.
- Books donated by various publishers or authors were checked by the teacher librarian to make sure that the content did not violate the national security law.
- The student works or posters of various units within the campus were checked by the teacher-in-charge to ensure they did not contain contents that endanger national security.

- All events organised did not involve any acts and activities that endanger national security.
- All library collections were reviewed before the start of the academic year.
- The mechanism of reviewing new purchased books and donated books was generally smooth and should be continued in the next academic year.
- The display of words or objects in the campus, publications and leaflets did not contain contents that endanger national security.


